Process led by SRP Working Group 3: Farmer Support, Performance Measurement, and Assurance, and SRP Secretariat


Aug 2017: Workshop with SRP pilots and SRP members to develop first draft of revised SRP Standard


Sep – Nov 2017: Public stakeholder consultation on revised draft per ISEAL guidance Dec 2018 – Dec 2019: Incorporated public comments; developed additional drafts; voted on final product

Jan 2019: Launch of SRP Standard Version 2.0 at SRP Annual Plenary

Public consultation round: **458 comments**



SRP WG3 Recommendation (continued)

More than 90% of WG3 members agreed to revise the "Working toward sustainable rice cultivation" milestone

- Raise the minimum score to meet this milestone from 10 points to 33 points (on the 1-100 scale) to reflect field testing results
- Specify a set of requirements for which thresholds must be met to meet this milestone



Summary of Changes: Cross-cutting

- Number of requirements reduced to 41 (from 46)
- Ambiguous language clarified
- New compliance / score options for many requirements added
- Additionally, opportunity to develop National Interpretation Guidelines highlighted, linkage with SRP Performance Indicators strengthened, and linkage with SRP Assurance Framework established











Summary of Changes: Farm Management

	Version 1.0	Version 2.0
1 Crop calendar	Required planning on timing, labor, inputs, and finances	Focus planning on timing elements only
2 Record keeping	Single list of data points	Separated into "basic" and "intermediate" lists of data points to better reflect who has ability to collect different data
3 Training	Training topics prescribed as fixed list	Topics determined by needs assessment; scoring rewards participation in authorized SRP training







Summary of Changes: Preplanting

	Version 1.0	Version 2.0
4 Heavy metals	Required risk assessment or soil testing or other proof for top score	Requires milled grain testing and risk assessment for top score to reflect high stakeholder concern for food safety; added score options
5 Soil salinity		Added score option
6 Land conversion and biodiversity	Focused on land conversion	Added biodiversity elements
7 Invasive species	Binary (Y/N)	Considers when species introduced; added score option to reward effective management
8 Leveling		Added score options
9 Pure seed quality		Highlights this topic as one for further specification under National Interpretation Guidelines







Summary of Changes: Water Use

	Version 1.0	Version 2.0
10 Water management		Provides definitions for each of the three production systems for clarity; includes updated list of measures for each system; added score options
11 Irrigation system at community level	"irrigation system"	Clarifies applicability to "command area" only; added score option
12 Inbound water quality		Added score option
13 Groundwater extraction	"water extraction"	Clarifies applicability to "groundwater extraction" only; added score option
14 Drainage	"subsurface drainage"	Clarifies applicability to "intentional surface (sideways) drainage" only; added score option

15 Nutrient management	Duplication with other requirement noted	Integrates content from former R18 (Inorganic fertilizer use) in Version 1.0 – former R18 deleted
16 Organic fertilizer choice		Clarifies language; added score option
17 Inorganic fertilizer choice	"trustworthy source"	Clarifies language







Summary of Changes: Pest Management

	Version 1.0	Version 2.0
18	Overall score awarded for "good IPM" based on practices related to 6 pests; discrepancies noted in method to arrive at aggregate score	Eliminates aggregate scoring (18.1 – 18.6 now scored separately with a maximum 3 points each); Integrates content from former R20, 21, 22 (pesticide selection, targeted application, label instructions) in Version 1.0 – former R20, 21, 22 deleted
18.1 – 18.5 (Weed, Insect, Disease, Mollusc, Rodent management)		Restructures criteria to align with IPM approach and order of actions recommended by following IPM principles; added score options and threshold
18.6 Bird management		Added score options and threshold







Summary of Changes: Harvest and Postharvest

	Version 1.0	Version 2.0
19 Timing of harvest	"appropriate time"	Provides guidance to clarify appropriate times for harvest; allows for further specification under National Interpretation Guidelines; added score option
20 Harvest equipment		Provides additional guidance for mechanical equipment; added score option
21 Drying time		Includes moisture content for additional uses of rice; added score option
22 Drying technique	"sustainable drying techniques"	Includes sustainable techniques for sun- and mechanical-drying
23 Rice storage		Added measure
24 Rice stubble		Revised language; added score option
25 Rice straw		Revised language; added score option

26 Safety instruction and first aid	Emphasis on first aid supply availability on-farm	Emphasis on workers knowing how to access first aid (kit or services)
27 Tools and equipment	Duplication with other requirement noted	Integrates content from former R23 (calibration) in Version 1.0 – former R23 deleted
28 Training of pesticide applicators		Provides suggested training topics as guidance
29 PPE	4 measures	5 measures; considers drone application
30 Washing and changing	"facilities"	Highlights importance of separate facilities for washing, changing, and household use
31 Applicator restrictions		(no change)

	Version 1.0	Version 2.0
35 Child labor		Uses ILO text; differentiates between family members and non-family members more clearly
36 Hazardous work	Included intermediate scoring option	Uses ILO text; makes scoring binary
37 Education		(no change)
38 Forced labor		Adds 48 hour work week requirement
39 Discrimination		Adds no bullying or physical punishment requirement
40 Freedom of association		(no change)
41 Wages		Adds language on negotiated agreements and overtime pay

What's next?

Standard Version 2.0 may undergo further revisions within 2019.

Implementation is most likely to highlight errors in consistency or wording that require further clarification.

During field testing of the Standard Version 2.0 the old Standard Version 1.0 still remains a valid document. Version 1.0 is expected to be phased out by 31 December 2019.

A full revision of Version 2.0 is expected for 2023 at the latest, or earlier if seen necessary by SRP members.
